Carol A. Daniel is first and foremost a mother and wife. When she isn't chasing her two sons or cooking delectable meals for her husband, she is anchoring award-winning newscasts and co-hosting afternoon drive, "Total Information PM" for the number one news/talk station in the country, KMOX.

Carol began her career at the "Voice of St. Louis" in 1995 as an anchor, reporter and talk show host. She was hired by then-program director, Tom Langmyer. Now the VP and general manager, Langmyer was driving to Memphis with his family when he heard Carol on the air at a radio station in Cape Girardeau, MO. Two weeks later, Daniel was working at KMOX.

The 21 year veteran of broadcasting brings a wealth of experience to KMOX. She was once a cable television host in Kansas City, a campaign organizer, a recruiter for the U.S. Census Bureau, and even worked as a substitute teacher! Carol says it is interviewing interesting people like Dr. Phil and Patti LaBelle and covering breaking news like the death of former Governor Mel Carnahan and promoting charitable causes like Habitat for Humanity that makes each and every day at KMOX credible.

Daniel can also be heard as producer and anchor of a twice-weekly afternoon segment, "In Focus," and co-hosting a summer Saturday show, "Between Friends."

Carol is a gifted motivational speaker, guiding thousands of people each year to realize their potential. "I always knew I wanted to inspire others and working at KMOX enables me to do so." Two years ago, Carol added columnist to her titles. She uses both a humorous touch and serious observations of life in her column, "Carol's Journal," featured in the award-winning St. Louis American Newspaper.
